

### **Code and Conduct for the Students**

All students must deter from indulging in any and all forms of misconduct including partaking in any activity off-campus which can affect the University's interests and reputation substantially.

The various forms of misconduct include:

- a. Any act of discrimination (physical or verbal conduct) based on an individual's gender, caste, race, religion or religious beliefs, color, region, language, disability, or sexual orientation, marital or family status, physical or mental disability, gender identity, etc.
- b. Intentionally damaging or destroying University property or property of other students and/or faculty members
- c. Consumption or distribution of intoxicants like alcohol/drugs/ psychotropic substances in any form or smoking or chewing, Pan masala, spitting etc.. are strictly prohibited;
- d. It is strongly advised to refrain from activities such as scribbling or noting on walls, door or furniture which could deface the University and destroy the academic ambiance;
- e. Carefully handle the furniture, equipment, fixtures and appliances of the college and lab. Careless handling/misuse of the above could result in personal injuries or damage to property. Any violation of this shall invite a financial penalty;
- f. Theft or abuse of the University computers and other electronic resources such as computer and electronic communications facilities, systems, and services which includes unauthorized entry , use, tamper, etc. of University property or facilities, private residences of staff, offices, labs, classrooms, computers networks, and other restricted facilities and interference in the work of others is punishable.
- g. Use of threat or violence against members of the staff or fellow students will be considered as very serious cases of misconduct.
- h. Any disruptive activity in a classroom, or in an event sponsored by the University
- i. Unable to produce the identity card, issued by the University, or refusing to produce it on demand by campus security guards

The following activities are banned in the university premises

- a. Organizing meetings and processions without permission from the University Accepting membership of religious or terrorist groups banned by the University / Government of India
- b. Unauthorized possession, carrying or use of any weapon, ammunition, explosives, or potential weapons, fireworks, contrary to law or policy.
- c. Unauthorized possession or use of harmful chemicals and banned drugs.
- d. Littering and dirtying the campus of the University
- e. Parking a vehicle in a no parking zone or in an area earmarked for parking other types of vehicle.
- f. Rash driving on the campus that may cause any inconvenience to others.
- g. Not disclosing a pre-existing health condition, either physical or psychological, to the Dean/Director/HOD which may cause hindrance to the academic progress.
- h. Theft or unauthorized access to other's resources.
- i. Misbehavior with faculty, staff or other students, during any activity of the University.
- j.. Engaging in disorderly, lewd, or indecent conduct, including, but not limited to, creating unreasonable noise; pushing and shoving; inciting or participating in a riot or group disruption at the University.

Anti-Ragging:

As per the Regulations framed by the University Grants Commission (UGC) vide Gazette Notification No. F.1-16/2007 (CPP-II) dated 17.6.2009 of the Govt. of India and amendments issued by the UGC on dates 8/10/2012, 25/12/2013 and 29/06/2016 and other Regulating Councils as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force, Ragging is totally prohibited in the University campus, and if anyone found culprit would be detained. Any active or passive involvement in the case of ragging would not be accepted. Any person promoting, or indirectly relating to it, would be brought under strict punishment. The actions against Ragging would not be only limited to University campus but to all the facilities accessed by the students of different colleges. Ragging shall be held as an offence in the University classes, canteen, playgrounds, hostels and transportation facilities (accessed by students may it be private or public).
