

Scheme of Assessment (2011-2015 Batches)

Grading of a Subject

A letter grade system for batch 2011 to 2015 is followed by the University for Assessment of the student's performance in a subject as given in following table:

Performance	Letter Grade	Grade Point Value Per Credit	Corresponding Range of Numerical Marks in Percentage
Outstanding	A+	10	90% and above
Excellent	A	9	80% to < 90%
Very Good	B	8	65% to < 80%
Good	C	6	50% to < 65%
Satisfactory	D	4	40% to < 50%
Fail / Detained	F	0 (ZERO)	Less than 40% marks or detained in the subject for attendance less than 75% (Less than 65%, if condoned).

Grade for a subject shall be awarded separately for Internal Assessment, External Assessment and Combined Assessment based on Internal Assessment Marks, External Assessment Marks and Combined Marks (Internal plus External) respectively. In case a student has obtained Grade F in either Internal Assessment or External Assessment or Internal as well as External Assessments, he / she shall be declared as not having cleared and completed that subject. The Combined Grade for such cases shall be indicated by 'Grade F' against the subject(s) and the student shall not earn credits for that subject. Such a student shall have to re-appear in the subject(s) in that component(s) in which he / she has obtained Grade F (Internal and / or External Examination, as the case may be). Grade awarded to a student for a re-appear in Internal Examination in a subject shall be Grade D, if he / she obtains 40% or higher marks in Internal Assessment, irrespective of the actual marks obtained by him/her. However, grade awarded for re-appear in External Examination shall be as per actual marks obtained by the student.

The students are awarded a letter grade from the prescribed grade system in each subject in a semester. For each pass grade in a subject, the student earns credits for that subject. The academic performance of the students is indicated in terms of the number of credits that he/she has earned and the weighted grade point average. A specified minimum number of credits shall be earned on semester or session basis in order to qualify for continuation in the academic programme and for the award of degree.

Grade Point Average

The performance of a student shall be evaluated in terms of two indices, viz., the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) which is the Grade Point Average for a semester and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) which is the Grade Point Average for all the completed semesters at any point of time.

Calculation of SGPA

$$\text{SGPA} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^k \text{Credits of Subject } i \times \text{Grade Point Value for Subject } i}{\sum_{i=1}^k \text{Credits of Subject } i}$$

Where k = Number of subjects in the Semester

Calculation of CGPA

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{\sum_{j=1}^I \text{Total Credits of Semester } j \times \text{SGPA of Semester } j}{\sum_{j=1}^I \text{Total Credits of Semester } j}$$

Where I = Number of Semester(s) completed upto date

Scheme of Assessment (2016 Onwards)

A letter grade system for batch 2016 Onwards is followed by the University for Assessment of the student's performance in a subject as given in following table:

Grade Point Average

The performance of a student shall be evaluated in terms of two indices, viz., the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) which is the Grade Point Average for a semester and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) which is the Grade Point Average for all the completed semesters at any point of time.

Calculation of SGPA

$$\text{SGPA} = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^k \text{Credits of Subject } i \times \text{Grade Point Value for Subject } i}{\sum_{i=1}^k \text{Credits of Subject } i}$$

Where k = Number of subjects in the Semester

Calculation of CGPA

$$\text{CGPA} = \frac{\sum_{j=1}^l \text{Total Credits of Semester } j \times \text{SGPA of Semester } j}{\sum_{j=1}^l \text{Total Credits of Semester } j}$$

Where l = Number of Semester(s) completed up to date

Scheme of Assessment (For B.Pharmacy Programme)

1. Grade in a Subject

To assess the performance of a student, grading system as given in table below is followed.

3.	70% - < 79.99%	Good	B	8
4.	60% - < 69.99%	Fair	C	7

6.	Less than 50%	Fail	F	0
7.	Absent	Fail	F	0

2. A student has to obtain a minimum of 50% marks including Internal Assessment and External Assessment to pass in a subject and to earn credits for that subject.
3. For Grading in a subject, marks obtained in Internal Assessment and External Assessment are added together (provided the student has obtained a minimum of 50% marks including Internal Assessment and External Assessment) and Combined Grade is awarded in the subject as per grading system given at paragraph 1 above. In case a student fails to secure a minimum of 50% marks including Internal Assessment or External Assessment, the Combined Grade awarded is Grade F, he / she have to secure minimum 50% marks including Internal Assessment or External Assessment, by reappearing to obtain valid grade in that subject.

4. **Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)**

SGPA for a semester is calculated as under, after the student has passed in all the subjects of a semester.

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^k (\text{Credits of Subject } i \times \text{Grade points for Subject } i)}{\sum_{i=1}^k (\text{Credits of Subject } i)}$$

Where k = Number of Subjects in the Semester

5. **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)**

CGPA is calculated as under, after the student has passed in all the subjects of all the semesters of the courses, as per prescribed scheme of studies.

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum_{j=1}^N (\text{Total Credits of Semester } j \times SGPA \text{ of Semester } j)}{\sum_{j=1}^N \text{Total Credits of Semester } j}$$

Where N = Total Number of Semesters in the course.

6. **Conversion of Grade Point Average Into Percentage Marks**

For conversion of Grade point Value for a subject, SGPA for a semester or CGPA for all the semesters into percentage marks; these are to be multiplied by 9.5.

Scheme of Assessment (Ph.D. Programme)

1. Grade in a Subject

To assess the performance of a student, grading system as given in table below is followed.

Sr. No.	% Marks	Grade	Letter Grade	Grade Points
1.	$\geq 90\% \text{ \& } \leq 100\%$	Outstanding	O	10
2.	$\geq 80\% \text{ \& } < 90\%$	Excellent	A+	9
3.	$\geq 70\% \text{ \& } < 80\%$	Good	A	8
4.	$\geq 60\% \text{ \& } < 70\%$	Fair	B+	7
5.	$\geq 50\% \text{ \& } < 60\%$	Average	B	6
6.	$< 50\%$	Fail	F	0
7.	Absent	Fail	F	0

- A student has to obtain a minimum of 50% marks in Internal Assessment and External Assessment separately to pass in a subject and to earn credits for that subject.
- For Grading in a subject, marks obtained in Internal Assessment and External Assessment are added together (provided the student has obtained a minimum of 50% marks in Internal Assessment as well as External Assessment separately) and Combined Grade is awarded in the subject as per grading system given at paragraph 1 above. In case a student fails to secure a minimum of 50% marks in Internal Assessment or External Assessment or in both Internal Assessment and External Assessment, the Combined Grade awarded is Grade F, he / she have to secure minimum 50% marks in Internal Assessment or External Assessment separately, by reappearing to obtain valid grade in that subject.

4. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)

SGPA for a semester is calculated as under, after the student has passed in all the subjects of a semester.

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum_{i=1}^k (\text{Credits of Subject } i \times \text{Grade points for Subject } i)}{\sum_{i=1}^k (\text{Credits of Subject } i)}$$

Where k = Number of Subjects in the Semester

5. Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

CGPA is calculated as under, after the student has passed in all the subjects of all the semesters of the courses, as per prescribed scheme of studies.

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum_{j=1}^N (\text{Total Credits of Semester } j \times \text{SGPA of Semester } j)}{\sum_{j=1}^N \text{Total Credits of Semester } j}$$

Where N = Total Number of Semesters in the course.

6. Conversion of Grade Point Average Into Percentage Marks

For conversion of Grade point Value for a subject, SGPA for a semester or CGPA for all the semesters into percentage marks; these are to be multiplied by 9.5.
